



## The following advice could assist in preventing your car getting stolen

- Don't leave your car keys on the side in the kitchen, on view or in reach of a letterbox or catflap.
- Always ensure that your vehicle is locked when not in use and check the door handle to make sure before you walk away.
- If you have a garage at home, use it to secure your vehicle in, or if you park on your driveway make sure it is well lit.
- If you have gates on your property ensure that they are closed and locked, you may also consider the fitting of a security post/bollard.
- If you decide to fit additional security equipment to your car, make sure it is 'Thatcham Quality Assured' or 'Sold Secure Tested'.
- Tracking devices are also available and may suit more expensive or high performance vehicles.
- Make sure that euro-cylinder locks on your home either achieve 'TS 007 (3 Star rating)' or 'Sold Secure Diamond' standards.
